## Constitution for the AGC Student Chapter of Pratt Institute

## Article I - General

**Section I:** The name of this organization shall be the Associated General Contractors of America Student Chapter of Pratt Institute.

**Section II:** This organization shall seek recognition by the Associated General Contractors of America and similar bodies. The purpose of this organization shall be to promote the interests of its members and to advance the professional goals of its members.

**Section III:** The primary office of this student chapter shall be located at:

## Article II - Membership

This organization does not discriminate against anyone based on race, creed, color, national origin, age or sex.

**Section I:** Membership shall be of the following types, Regular and Honorary.

**Section III:** No vote shall be required for membership; however, all members are required to attend bi-monthly meetings, held at the discretion of the executive board.

**Section IV:** Failure to attend bi-monthly meetings may result in a suspension of membership, as well as the right to participate in all chapter activities.

**Section V:** Honorary members are those appointed by the executive board and its membership with a majority vote. An honorary member shall not have voting privileges.

## Article III - Officers

Section I: The chapter shall have three (3) officers: President, Vice President and

- o Shall prepare an annual report of proposed activities for the upcoming scholastic year

- Secretary/Treasurer:

- o Shall be responsible for recording minutes for all meetings. In addition, the secretary/treasurer shall send all memo's and correspondence for the chapter upon approval by the president/vice president

## Article IV – Meetings

**Section I:** Regularly scheduled meetings shall be held Bi-monthly. Exact dates shall be announced with ample notice, at least two weeks prior.

**Section II:** Special meetings shall be called by the chapter officers as needed.

**Section III:** Meetings shall not be held during any breaks in or between semesters.

**Section IV:** Meetings may be excused to members unable to attend. A maximum of two (2) absences will be permissible per scholastic year.

## Article V – Executive Board Members

**Section I:** The Executive Board shall consist of: President, Vice President,

general membership.

**Section II:** The faculty advisor may not cast a vote in elections; however, in the event of a tie, the advisor shall vote in order to break the tie.

**Section III:** The faculty advisor shall be chosen by the chapter in a vote open to the general membership. The advisor shall serve a one-year term and may be re-elected. The advisor shall be involved.

## Article VI – Committees

**Section I:** The election committee shall be appointed by the President and Vice President after all nominations for officers have been made. The committee shall be headed by the faculty advisor and two members that are appointed by the President and Vice President.

## Article VII – Term Durations

**Section II:** In the event of a resignation, impeachment, sickness or inability to fulfill emergency election until all situations are alleviated

## Article VIII – Voting/Elections

**Section I:** All decisions shall require a majority vote to be ratified.

**Section II:** The president shall vote only in the event of a tie.

**Section IV:** Nominations for office shall be announced during the second-to-last meeting of the scholastic year.

**Section V:** Members with an excused absence from the election/nomination meeting may submit an absentee ballot to the secretary/treasurer.

**Section VII:** Newly elected officers/board members will begin term at the beginning of

**Section VIII:** In the event of a voting error, all votes shall be disregarded, and new between the nominees.

**Section IX:** Each nominee for president and vice president must have previously been an active member of the chapter for at least one year, except for founding officers

## Article IX – Finances

Section I: No organizational monies may be used by anyone for personal use.

Section II: The secretary/treasurer shall present an annual proposed budget, and work with the Executive Board to allocate monies to be spent on projects, trips, etc. for the upcoming scholastic year.

Section III: Money to be spent must have executive board and membership approval.

Section IV: Every person to be paid back any monies spent that are

in excess of the District and school Monies. District and school monies are not to be used for personal use. A receipt must be provided for all monies spent. Receipts must be provided to the treasurer in order to be properly kept and reimbursement.

## Article X – Impeachment

Section I: Any officer or board member of the chapter may be impeached

for misconduct, breach of trust, or any other cause deemed in the eyes of the members for proceedings brought against him or her. Impeachment shall be by a two-thirds vote of the members, acting through a majority of the Executive Board.

Section II: The penalty for impeachment shall be that the officer or board member shall be removed from office for the remainder of the school year, and he/she cannot run for office for the following scholastic year. He/she still retains membership in the organization, if the individual so desires.

## Article XI – Amendments

Section I: Amendments may be proposed to this constitution by any member of the

chapter, at any time, and shall be subject to the same procedure as amendments to the constitution.
